

4.2 The Results of The Analysis

According to analysis above, there are five speech act classification in the Barack Obama's Speech at Gates Foundation comprises of Declarations has 15 times (24,19%), Representatives has 19 times (30,64%), Directives has 11 times (17,74%), Expressives has 10 times (16,13%) and Commissives has 7 times (11,30%). So, the highest speech act classification is Representatives (30,64%). The amounts of the speech act classification would be count as below:



Declarations : $15 \times 100\% = 24, 19\%$
